

## Step-by-Step Guide: Organizing a Month's-Mind Intention at Your Parish (Catholic Guide)

A **Month's-Mind Mass** is celebrated about one month after a loved one's passing. It is a traditional Catholic practice especially important in Vietnamese and Hispanic Catholic communities, marking the ongoing prayers for the soul of the deceased and offering comfort to the family.

### 1. Contact the Parish Office (4 Weeks Before)

- Call or visit your parish office.
- Request a **Mass Intention** for your loved one on or near the 30-day anniversary.
- Provide the deceased's full name, date of death, and your family contact information.
- Ask about available Mass times and whether your family can bring up gifts, read intentions, or light a memorial candle.

### 2. Confirm Liturgical Details (2–3 Weeks Before)

- Meet briefly with the parish secretary or priest to confirm:
  - Date, time, and type of Mass (weekday or Sunday).
  - Whether a special **mention in the Prayers of the Faithful** will be included.
  - Any parish customs for Month's-Mind observances (flowers, altar candles, procession, incense).
- Ask about options for bilingual or multicultural elements if your family requests it.

### 3. Invite Family & Friends (2 Weeks Before)

- Call, text, or send invitations to family and close friends.
- Share the Mass date and time clearly.

- Encourage relatives to bring a photo, rosary, or small offering if culturally appropriate.
- Let the extended family know if there will be a small gathering or meal afterward.

#### **4. Prepare Participation Roles (1 Week Before)**

- Confirm with the parish if family members can:
  - Bring up the gifts (bread and wine).
  - Do a reading or lead the Responsorial Psalm.
  - Offer a brief remembrance or prayer of thanksgiving.
- Select and prepare those family members ahead of time.

#### **5. Day of the Mass**

- Arrive at least **15–20 minutes early** to greet the priest and confirm details.
- Provide the sacristan with your loved one's name for correct pronunciation.
- Sit together as a family, near the front if possible.
- Participate in the offertory, prayers, and communion with reverence.

#### **6. After the Mass**

- Thank the priest and parish staff for their support.
- Consider hosting a small gathering (meal, coffee, or simple snacks) with family and friends to share memories and continue support.
- If desired, make a **memorial donation** to the parish or another meaningful cause in your loved one's name.

#### **7. Ongoing Remembrance**

- Mark the **one-year anniversary (Giỗ Đầu / Year's Mind Mass)** on your calendar now.

- Ask your parish about including your loved one in the parish's **Book of Remembrance** or November All Souls' Day liturgy.

# QUICK CHECKLIST

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**4 weeks  
BEFORE**

**2-3 weeks  
BEFORE**

<input type="checkbox"/>	Confirm date, time, and details with priest or parish staff.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Ask about including Prayers of the Faithful, candle lighting, or family roles.

**2 Weeks  
BEFORE**

<input type="checkbox"/>	Invite family and close friends.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Share if there will be a gathering afterward.

**1 Weeks  
BEFORE**

<input type="checkbox"/>	Assign family participation (readings, gifts, prayers).
<input type="checkbox"/>	Confirm all details with the parish office.

**Day of mass**

<input type="checkbox"/>	Arrive early, meet with priest/sacristan.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Sit together as a family, participate reverently.

**After Mass**

<input type="checkbox"/>	Thank parish staff.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Host a small gathering or meal (optional).
<input type="checkbox"/>	Consider a memorial donation in your loved one's name.

**Ongoing**

<input type="checkbox"/>	Mark the 1-year anniversary Mass and All Souls' Day for future remembrance.
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
